



Go Big or Go Home.

"Where there is no prophetic vision, the people cast off restraint, but blessed is he who keeps the law" (Prov. 29:18 ESV). This proverb. variously translated, says that those without a vision from the word of God are not guided by it. Such people and ministries (!) will perish. This is in keeping with Ps. 127:1: "Unless the Lord builds the house, those who build it labor in vain." But its that second part of verse 18 that really sets the vision: "blessed is he who keeps the Torah." Ah, the Torah, not merely the law, but the great promises of Gospel that frame and drive the Bible's story. What kind of vision does one get from the biblical gospel? The expansion of the kingdom of God through conversions and allegiance to Jesus Christ. That vision should be grand, even if our own contributions be never so humble. Each has their part to play and together the vision is grand: "Make disciples of all ethnos (every ethnic people, age notwithstanding) by baptizing them into the Name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit" (Matt. 28:19 my translation). A contemporary way to express this kingdom vision to make disciples is: Go big or go home.

The provision for LCMS missions in 2021 was unprecedented. Your prayers, support and generosity have facilitated opportunities to "go big" a reality. In the last issue, we reported on three expanding opportunities. The

The next study week intensive will take place in Rīga and Saldus, Latvia, 2-9 April, with at least twelve nations represented, including newcomer Estonia and a student from Nepal.

first endeavor was the Rīga Luther Academy. In March, leadership from the Academy and the Latvian Evangelical Lutheran Church and the LCMS Office of International Mission will meet in Wittenberg to explore opportunities to broach faithful pastoral training into new domains. Please pray for a shared vision so that we may aid our Latvian partners and accomplish the mission of training evangelists, church planters, and skilled servants of the Church.

The second endeavor was initiated by Gottfried Martens (Berlin) and missionary Rev. Christian Tiews (Hanover) to bring the gospel and true biblical instruction to Farsi speaking people in Europe, but also Iran. That works has expanded to include voiceovers in Urdu for Pakistan. Three "beta" videos, under the project name "Operation Overlord," are now in production. If these prove successful in terms of response, then a series on the Small Catechism will be initiated. The work coordinates the Communications Team at the IC in St. Louis, the Eurasia Region of OIM, CTSFW and our partners in SELK. It is estimated that the potential audience for these videos could number in the millions. The vision includes networking pastors for discipleship and connecting respondents with existing churches This work is going big, big time.

The third endeavor focuses on Pakistan and the ever-expanding work of Rev. Jay Dass and Deacon Samson Sohail. What seemed like a quaint attempt to reintroduce biblical Christianity to Pakistanis in Islamabad has become a huge opportunity. Now there are four cities involved, the training of eleven persons, two existing congregations learning the Small Catechism and the Augsburg Confession, and standing up three church plants. OIM and the Eurasia Region have been emboldened to engage this ministry with gusto. Meanwhile, all

cylinders are firing in Luther Academy's fourth semester. While we pray for peace regarding Putin's aspirations for Ukraine, this will not end work in any location, even Ukraine. To be sure, the work may be hampered, but we are resolved to witness to Jesus no matter what geo-political machinations materialize. The word of the Lord will endure forever.






